JOHN PHILLIPS MEDAL


(established 1960 by Dr W.S. Bisat)

Criteria: Awarded by the Yorkshire Geological Society as an acknowledgement of distinguished contributions to, or to work bearing upon knowledge, of the stratigraphy or palaeontology of the North of England.

Frequency: Not more frequently than once every 2 years

Criteria: Awarded as an acknowledgement of distinguished contributions to geological knowledge, either of Yorkshire and the North of England, or by a person associated with Yorkshire or the North of England by birth, training or locus of research.

Frequency: Not more frequently than once every 2 years

Replaced by Fearnsides Award in 2016



Criteria: Awarded as an acknowledgement of services to geology in the north of England.


Frequency: Not more frequently than once every 2 years

DR W.S. BISAT MEDAL

(Established in 2013 by Professor Patrick Boylan to mark the Society's 175th anniversary and the 50th anniversary of Dr Bisat's death)

Criteria: Awarded as an acknowledgement of distinguished contribution:

- to, or work bearing upon, applied geology in relation to northern England
- applied geology by a person associated with northern England by birth, training or locus of work.
- The medal can be awarded for distinction by professional practice and achievement, not necessarily through the traditional focus of published output.

Applied geology is interpreted widely, including not only long-standing fields (i.e. engineering geology, mining exploration and petroleum geology and hydrology) but also newer and emerging fields such as geoconservation, forensic geology and the public understanding and communication of geology.

Frequency: Not more frequently than once every 2 years

YORKSHIRE GEOLOGICAL SOCIETY FEARNSIDES AWARD

Launched in 2016, the YGS Fearnsides Award provides grants of up to £500 to support research by early career Earth Scientists with a connection to the North of England. Awards are intended to support clearly specified research or activities that add value and impact to an undergraduate or postgraduate project, such as presenting research outcomes at a major conference or following up a newly identified research opportunity.

To date the YGS Fearnsides Award has supported the following projects:

2016. Analyses of pseudotachylytes to characterise ancient earthquakes in Scotland and Norway — Lucy Campbell (University of Leeds)

2017. A revised chronology of Glacial Lake Pickering, Yorkshire UK. EGU 2018 Conference presentation — Laura Eddey (University of Sheffield)

2018. Taxonomic re-appraisal and 3D modelling of ichthyosaur specimens in Whitby Museum – Rebecca Bennion (University of Liège)

2018. Mapping and hazard appraisal of catastrophic debris flows in the Moroccan High Atlas – Madeleine Hann (University of Manchester)

2019. *Isotopic geochemical indicators of looming extinction in mid-Pliocene planktonic foraminifera* – Adam Woodhouse (University of Leeds)

YORKSHIRE GEOLOGICAL SOCIETY RESEARCH FUND

Launched in 2018, the YGS Research Fund provides grants of up to £1000 to individuals or small teams to support research in the Earth Sciences with a preferred, but not exclusive, connection to the North of England - this may be by birth, education, affiliation to a research establishment or research on the geology and landscape of the region itself. The scope of eligible research is broad, and the Society encourages applicants who are working independently of formal supervision and financial support, especially to assist publication.

To date the YGS Research Fund has supporting the following projects:

2018. Detailed logging and geochemical sampling of early Jurassic mudstones at Redcar, exposed by the Beast from the East storm in 2018 – Jed Atkinson (University of Leeds)

2018. Preservation of a major new Pliosaur find from the Kimmeridge Clay of North Lincolnshire – Scunthorpe Pliosaur Project Team (independent voluntary researchers)

2018. Comparative dating of the last deglaciation on the western and eastern flanks of the Pennines – Andy Emery (University of Leeds)

2018. Structural appraisal and dating of the Cleveland Dyke and associated crosscutting carbonate veins — Jack Lee (Durham University)

2019. Photogrammetric study of the sedimentary architecture of the Kinderscoutian Lower Brimham Grit — Dr Roman Soltan (independent researcher affiliated to University of Leeds)

2019. Osmium isotope excursions as indicators of glacier dynamics and climate change, Baffin Bay – Emma Ownsworth (Durham University)

2019. Sedimentological study of post-industrial Anthropocene deposits on the Durham Heritage Coast – Dr Fabian Wadsworth (Durham University)
